- Fabrics used are of the same weight, same quality throughout unless a change is needed for the design.
- Quilting is evenly stitched with uniform stitches, whether by hand or machine.
- Hand and home sewing machine quilting must be the work of the exhibitor.
- Long arm quilting may be done by a professional.
- Knots should be hidden in the batting.
- Pattern marks should not be obvious.
- Binding should be neat, even, secure, with neat corners.
